Elisha The Double Blessed Prophet

Chapter 10: Elisha's Final Miracle ~ 2 Kings 13:14-21

Overview

<i>Chapter 10</i>	Elisha's Final Miracle
<i>The Promise of Deliverance</i>	God was prepared to deliver Israel from the Syrian Army. The promise had nothing to do with strength, age or righteousness but solely based on grace and strength of the Lord (2 Kings 13:15-17). Deliverance comes in different forms; The Lord stands ready to deliver us from any snare or temptation.
<i>The Principle of Devotion</i>	Elisha promised Joash's deliverance, but he tested his devotion first. The king's devotion was lacking as indicated by his half-hearted response to Elisha's request. We have similar behaviors in our Christian Walk. We avoid giving in to all that God wants us to do. Our devotion is not always "heartily" (Colossians 3:23). Our devotion needs to match our request.
<i>A Word of Deliverance</i>	Joash, the wicked king was responsible for the suffering of his entire nation. Elisha's message to Joash was one of GRACE. The miracle God granted Joash is to remind us that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8).
<i>A Word of Devotion</i>	A devoted heart, dedicated to God's work. At the end of the day, our tiredness should be a godly kind of tired from doing godly things. Service to God with our gifts and the power he provides. ALL IN devotion is needed.
<i>A Word About Destiny</i>	A resurrection happens when we accept the love Christ has for us in our heart. A resurrection happens when we allow others to come in contact with the love we carry in us for Christ. God has plans for our lives that not even death has power over. (1 Corinthians 15:54-57). What is your destiny?

<i>Devotion</i>	In what areas of your Christian life is your devotion the most consistent? In what areas could your devotion go to a deeper level?
<i>Grace</i>	What do you learn about grace from how Elisha promised a victory to a wicked king like Joah?
<i>Legacy</i>	After you leave this earth, what part of your present life will still have an impact on others? (fruit that remains - John 15:5,16)

Conclusion

<i>Victory</i>	As powerful as the miracles of Elisha were, they cannot compare to the miracle God wants to do in our hearts today. God wants us to give us a new life here on earth and for all eternity.
